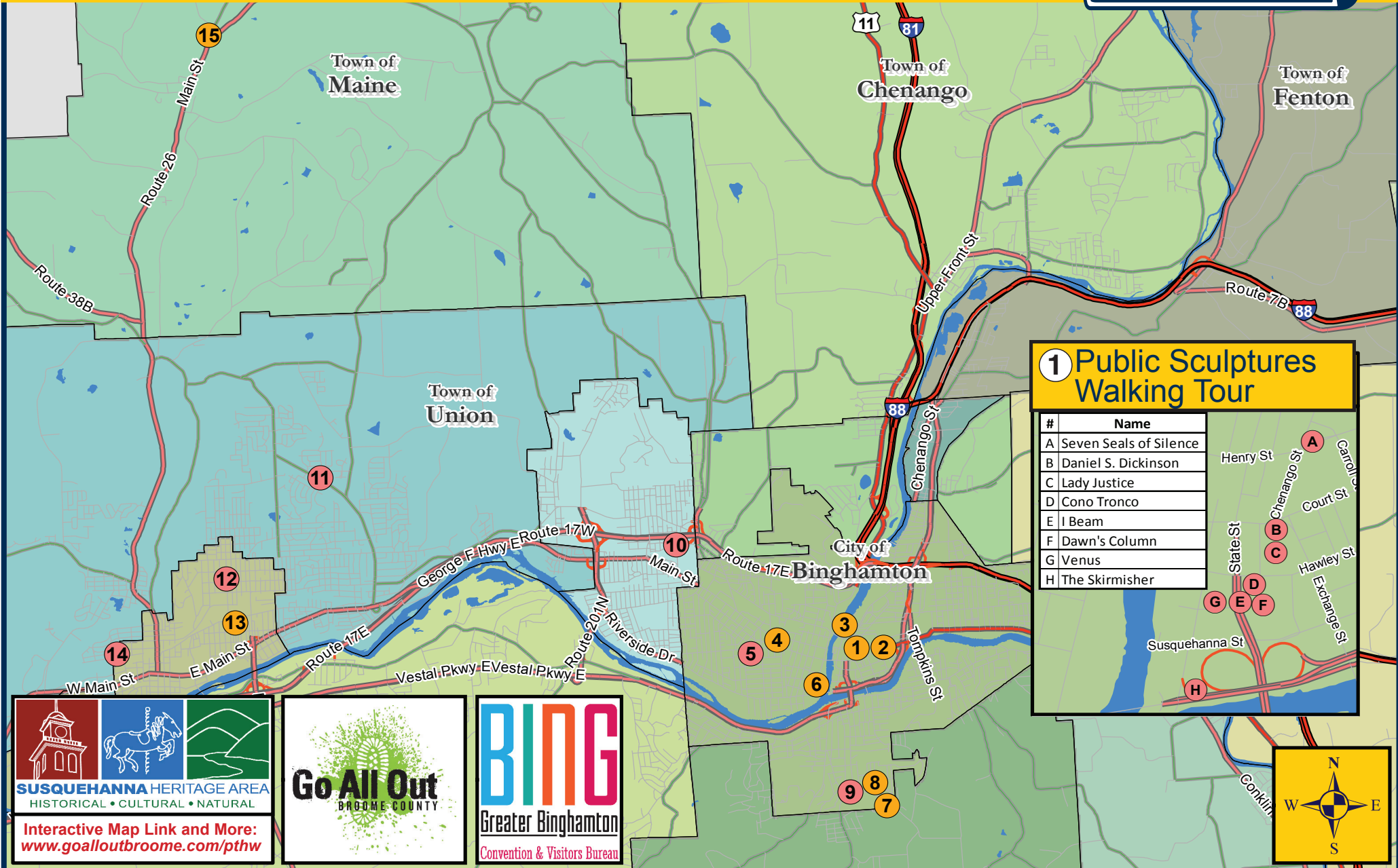
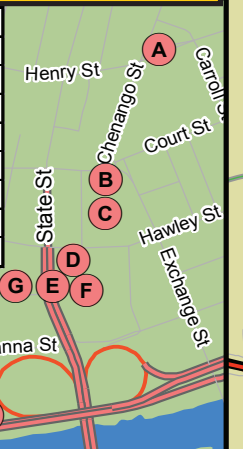

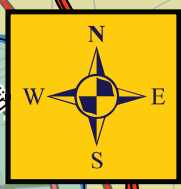

### 1 Broome County Arts Council's "Sculpture Outdoors" Walking Tour

Enjoy a guided, walking tour to eight public sculptures that trace a path through the history of downtown Binghamton! There will be three tours, beginning at 11AM, 1PM, and 3PM. Each tour will begin at Kennedy Park at the corner of Henry and Chenango Streets, then to the Broome County Court House, to Government Plaza, to 20 Hawley Street, and finally to Confluence Park. Learn about the artists and their works, hear stories about the community at the time each sculpture was erected. This public sculpture tour is the result of a research collaboration between the Broome County Arts Council, Binghamton University professor Kevin Hatch, and the BU Art History Department. Walk the "Sculpture Outdoors" path through downtown Binghamton history!

- Begin at Kennedy Park, Henry & Chenango Street
- Broome County Court House, Intersection of Chenango, Court, & Exchange Streets
- Government Plaza, Hawley Street
- 20 Hawley Street Apartments, (Stuart Street side)
- Finish at Confluence Park, off Memorial Bridge, North Shore Drive

### 2 The Life and Architecture of Isaac Gale Perry Presentation and Exhibit by Phelps Mansion Museum and Preservation Association of the Southern Tier (PAST)

191 Court Street, Binghamton, Museum Hours: 11AM – 5PM. Roger Luther, Executive Director of the Preservation Association of the Southern Tier (PAST) will present on the life and architecture of *Isaac Gale Perry, Binghamton's most famous architect at 2PM on Saturday and Sunday*. Isaac Perry's career began in 1858 with his design of the New York State Inebriate Asylum in Binghamton, now a National Historic Landmark. He designed some of the area's most spectacular churches, commercial blocks and residences, and state armories and other structures throughout New York. Perry served as State Architect and as lead architect for completion of the New York State Capitol. Exhibit includes photo exhibit of Perry's structures. Roger Luther has researched and photographed historic buildings throughout the Southern Tier and has worked to promote the preservation of its abandoned landmark structures. Roger's works include *Expressions of Faith – Exploring the Religious Structures of Broome County* and his most recent book, *Treasures of the Tier – Exploring Historic Properties in New York's Southern Tier*.
